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Man's spiritual beginnings.

The origins of ego.

The original creation of karma.

In the beginning, man was a God-centered Being, focused in his knowledge that he was an expression of the Creator's intention to establish, in this physical realm, a representation of his Presence. The peace and harmony that are the Essence of Divine vibration were instilled within each and every creature, human and non-human. And, a loving air of selfless participation in helping to co-create the expression of that intention permeated the consciousness of all.

There was no thought, in those times, to bettering one's lot, nor to outshining others. There was no tendency toward viewing the intentions of others as anything less than the purity that

all knew, to their very depths, was their own. There was never a thought to aspiring to the achievements of others, nor to the material rewards that accompanied them. There was no thought of doing less than the ultimate expression of one's own God-given capabilities.

It was a realm in which all gave their all for the mutual benefit of all. And, none perceived a sense of separation of purpose from another, nor from the totality that was Divine. It was in this harmonious environment that man was to dwell. And, it is to this expression of spirit-centered perfection and Oneness with all Creation, that he is destined to return.

Every major religion, throughout your earth-plane history has documented what has come to be known as man's fall from Grace. And, there has emerged, over time, a vast body of contradictory information that would explain and rationalize the reasons underlying man's divergence from his spiritually centered beginnings. There is much truth and much distortion in most of it.

Man's need to *know* began the process that ultimately led to his obscuring of the Divine focus with which he was created. The need to know the Essence of his own nature. The need to understand the mechanics of his existence. The need to reach out and harness what he perceived to be the vehicle for becoming Divine. Each, within himself, began to reach beyond blanket acceptance of his Oneness with the totality—to become *more*.

In the sense of separation man created for himself in that striving came the concept of ego. Man was no longer satisfied with harmonization. He no longer viewed his existence as an opportunity that was focused in the experiential—a chance to taste, in his physical expression, the perfection in unity. He wanted *more*. And, in that concept of *more*, man created the downward spiral upon which he has perpetuated his striving to improve upon perfection.

As the *separation* amongst men came to be perceived within the consciousness of each, each in his search for the key to limitlessness created his own limitations. For, the concept of limitation, by definition, could only exist relative to someone or something else. And, in the fragmentation of the initial unity of purpose, man emerged with a minute expression of what he once was able to experience in the totality. Given that diminished capacity and that diminished vibration he sought, through intellectual means, to recreate his remembrance of what he had understood to be his own essence. But that state-of-Being could not come to be, under conditions of self-perceived *separation*.

Eventually, even the remembrance was lost. All that remained was the concept of *striving* and the concept of differentiation from all else that was once a united Creation. Man forgot that, initially, the striving was toward improving upon the perfection of a God-centered existence. He forgot that peace and harmony were the foundations of the world in which he now perceived himself to be lost. He saw himself as isolated within his identity. And, in that space of isolation he created *fear*.

He no longer knew, unquestioningly, that all were there in harmony for the glory of all. He, in his aloneness, came to perceive the need to focus his attentions on his own physical well-being and survival. Others, who were also focused only on their own physical survival were seen as a potential threat. And, walls were erected mentally that reinforced the perception of separation from the Oneness that escalated exponentially.

Existence became rooted in fear for one's safety and survival. The concept of immortality and the unquestioned understanding that physical existence was but a limited expression of an Essence that could not be destroyed—with which man was initially instilled—became lost.

Man came to perceive the physical expression of his beingness as “all there is,” and fortified his abilities to preserve it at all costs. His entire focus turned to his own physical survival, and it became his only reason for being.

One's connection with the Creator and the part that each played as a harmonizing aspect of Creation became totally obscured in the clouds of negative karma man began to accumulate in his strivings for material elevation. For, to be *above*, there had, by definition, to be something or someone *below*. And, in that effort to outdo and outshine, it came to be perceived as less important if harm came to another, as long as one remained ahead.

Life became a race without a goal—striving for the sake of striving. And, the only purpose to one's existence came to be the accumulation of material evidence of a sense of self-worth

based on a foundation of the fear of unworthiness. One focused all one's efforts on amassing physical proof of one's elevation, regardless of the detriment incurred by others individually and by humankind as a whole. Those who found themselves trailing in this race compromised their integrity to gain an edge, and escalated the amount of negative karma with which they became increasingly burdened.

With the accumulating weight of negative karma under which man began to stagger came the relative diminishing of his spiritual vibration and the inclination to focus his energies in activities that would perpetuate that ongoing condition. He used his free will exclusively for his own material betterment. And in time, *free will* came into karmic balance with the *cause-and-effect* laws upon which the universe is based. Man seemed to be no longer automatically able to create his reality at will, but increasingly came to perceive himself as the *victim* of events and circumstances he could not control.

Negative emotions arose within him, as each perceived injustice was met by retaliation, which only served to create more negative karma. This, in turn, created more negative occurrences through which that karma could be counterbalanced.

Clans bonded together to unite their efforts toward overpowering other clans. Group karma resulted, as nations rose up to dominate and subjugate other nations, and to create material expressions of that powerbase that would come to threaten the well-being of the planet itself.

The collective vibration upon the Earth became so dense, so dark, and so charged with negativity that the isolated sparks of Light—the rare ones whose hearts could see beyond the limitations of physical reality, to a Divinity and a logic that superseded materialism—were all but obscured.

Through intensive *karmic compensation* over the centuries, some have emerged, in these times, with a relative clarity of vision that could lead back to the Source, if cultivated with care. And, there is no question that the intensive search for the meaning of one's existence which has taken untold thousands of years, has come full circle. When you have reached that realization, you become one with that realization. And, one with a legion of awakened souls, who together will re-establish the perfection in the beginnings from whence you've come.
